2026 Term I Course Outlines

Old Testament Survey

Course objectives: obtain working knowledge of Old Testament history timeline, be able to reasonably place stories, prophets, kings on that timeline. Understand and be able to articulate meta-narrative of Old Testament as it pertains to the Christian gospel message. Be able to identify and summarize the gist of each Old Testament book. Be able to place each Old Testament book on the timeline and correctly within the threefold breakdown of Law, Prophets and Writings. Be able to summarize and articulate Old Testament history, including Pre-Flood, Flood, Tower of Babel, Patriarchs, Egyptian Captivity, Exodus, Conquest, Judges, United Kingdom, Divided Kingdom, Babylonian Exile, Return.

Outside of class reading: Chronological historical narrative passages from Old Testament

New Testament Survey

Course objectives: obtain working knowledge of New Testament history timeline from conception of John the Baptist through writing of Revelation just prior to 100AD. Be able to name all 27 books of New Testament in order. Be able to place all 14 Pauline epistles in chronological order of their writing. Be able to place major events of Jesus' ministry in proper order on timeline. Gain a working understanding of the Christian gospel message.

Outside of class reading: Luke, Acts, Hebrews, Romans, Revelation

Christ in the Old Testament

Course objectives: obtain a working knowledge of the location and content of the major Old Testament prophecies concerning the life, ministry and mission of the Lord Jesus. Obtain familiarity with the Old Testament Christophanies. Obtain a working knowledge of some of the many pictorial/typological glimpses of Christ through Old Testament characters and stories. Be able to locate and utilize a number of Old Testament passages that pre-preach the gospel in advance of the coming of Jesus. Be able to identify at least one indicator/glimpse of the coming Messiah in each Old Testament book.

Outside of class reading: as assigned

Ephesians

Course objectives: be able to identify passages related to major themes of Ephesians: Salvation, the Church, Prayer & Spiritual Warfare. Memorize Ephesians 2:1-10. Recognize overall pattern of epistle with ch. 1-3 focused on Doctrine, ch. 4-6 focused on Application. Write a one or two page paper discussing the reality of the Christian's simultaneous present-tense simultaneous habitation on earth and in heavenly places. Write a one or two page paper discussing God's predestination of believers in the church. Write a one or two page paper discussing the role of prayer in the life of a Christian. Write a one or two page paper discussing the overall significance of the church in God's plan for the ages.
